In 2015, world leaders adopted the 2030 Sustainable Development Goals: 17 interrelated goals and 169 associated targets to guide global development.




# What is Alliance 8.7?

Alliance 8.7 is a coalition committed to achieving Target 8.7. Its mission is:


to assist all UN member States to fulfil their commitment to take immediate and effective measures to eradicate forced labour and end modern slavery and human trafficking by 2030 and to take immediate and effective measures to secure the prohibition and elimination of all forms of child labour including recruitment and use of child soldiers by 2025.

# International instruments on forced labour, modern slavery, human trafficking and child labour




#### 21 MILLION PEOPLE IN FORCED LABOUR

There are 11.5 million females and 9.5 million males in forced labour, of which 5.5 million are children.

#### **168 MILLION CHILDREN IN CHILD LABOUR**





### MOST VICTIMS ARE TRAFFICKED WITHIN THEIR SUBREGION OR COUNTRY


Shares of detected victims by subregional and transregional trafficking, 2010-2012



Within the subregion or country


From outside the subregion



### MILLIONS OF CHILDREN ARE AT INCREASED RISK OF ABUSE



Across the globe, nearly 50 million children have been uprooted.

28 million of them driven from their homes by conflicts, and millions more migrating in the hope of finding a better, safer life. All are at increased risk of forced labour, modern slavery, human trafficking and child labour.



Number and share of countries criminalizing trafficking in persons, partially or in full compliance with the UN Trafficking in Persons Protocol.



## A8.7 & PPP

### Pakistan / Packing & Recycling / Stora Enso

**ISSUE:** In the packaging and recycling sector in particular, children engaged in wheat straw collection endure long hours of work, as well as exposure to the sun, allergies and low levels of hygiene

<u>Response</u>: To strengthen its policy and global efforts to promote decent work and eliminate child labour in its value chain in Pakistan.

<u>Results</u>: Training programme for both management and workers' representatives ; Identified Decent Work deficits in the GSC ; Pilot Intervention in selected communities to support the progressive elimination of Child Labour.



## A8.7 & PPP

### Turkey/ Hazelnuts / COABISCO

**ISSUE:** During peak work periods, children do not go to school regularly, fall behind in their classes, and are unable to make up for this absence when they return to school.

<u>Response</u>: To enhance the capacity of local institutions; To develop withdrawal and prevention mechanisms for child labourers; To raise the awareness of families, employers, intermediaries, public and private sectors,

**<u>Results</u>**: 330 families who work as seasonal harvesters were reached; 381 children (6-15 years), 22 rural intermediaries, 104 hazelnut plantation owners were reached,



## A8.7 & PPP

### Cote d'Ivoire / Cocoa / Mars Inc.

**ISSUE:** On average, cocoa farmers earn less than USD 2 per day, an income below the poverty line. As a result, many often resort to child labour to keep their prices competitive

<u>Response</u>: Identifies girls and boys who are child labour by reinforcing community-based and institutional mechanisms ; Reinforces community development initiatives that create a protective environment for children

<u>**Results</u>**: Set up Child Protection Committees; mapping of available social services ; Pilot Intervention in selected communities to support the progressive elimination of Child Labour.</u>
